

THE DISTRICT

The Puyallup School District is currently the ninth largest district in the state of Washington, serving a population of approximately 122,806 residents. The district is located six miles east of Tacoma, 30 miles south of Seattle, and is situated in the heart of the Puyallup Valley.

The district has 22 elementary schools, seven junior high schools, three comprehensive senior high schools, and an alternative school, all of which serve more than 22,500 students with a budget of \$325 million.

The district employs approximately 1,350 certificated, 1,412 classified staff, and 650 substitute personnel.

OUR HISTORY

The Puyallup School District was organized in 1854 and was the third school district formed in the state of Washington. Fort Maloney, also known as the "Blockhouse," was built on the south bank of the Puyallup River. It was used by U.S. soldiers as a storehouse and was occupied by the John Carson family. Emma Carson was the first teacher in Puyallup and had four students in the Blockhouse School in 1861. Fort Maloney also served as the first post office.

SCHOLASTIC ACHIEVEMENTS

The Puyallup School District is celebrating gradual increases in graduation rates over the past several years. With 87.9% graduating in four years, and 90.2% in five years in 2018, Puyallup students are well above the state average.

In response to an increased demand for more competitive opportunities in academics, Puyallup offers an Advanced Placement Capstone program in each of the three comprehensive high schools. Highly Capable junior high students can enroll in AP courses at their neighborhood school, or attend the Puyallup Accelerated

Gifted Education (PAGE) Program offered regionally at three of the seven junior high schools. For elementary highly capable students, the QUEST Program is offered regionally at eight of the 22 elementary schools.

The Puyallup School District employs Achievement Via Individual Determination (AVID) strategies in 31 schools and boasts over 99 percent of AVID seniors from the class of 2018 graduated on time. The district is home to two Showcase Schools and two national AVID instructors. A comprehensive training program has resulted in the following:

- 28 percent of K-2 teachers are AVID trained
- 67 percent of grades 3-6 teachers are AVID trained
- 34 percent of secondary teachers are AVID trained

Using proven practices to teach students note-taking, organization, collaboration, reading, writing, and higher levels of questioning skills, Puyallup teachers are equipping students with skills that will help them be more successful in the classroom and in a global society.

With more than five percent of the student population speaking Spanish in their homes, the district has a growing population of English Language Learners who benefit from a strong ELL program, including dual language instruction at two elementary schools.

Knowing the long-term benefits, the PSD Board of Directors has placed significant value in early learning initiatives. For example, Kindergarten Academy is a 20-week early entrance program designed for children who have not had a formal preschool experience. Kindergarten Academy begins in January 2020.

The Puyallup School District owns and operates the Karshner Museum and Center for Culture & Arts which was founded in 1930 by Dr. and Mrs. Warner Karshner and includes over 10,000 artifacts and specimens in the collection. The museum provides students and visitors an opportunity to learn about the world's diverse cultures through participatory education. Through the integration of arts, and proven instructional strategies, students, teachers and visitors experience history and culture through field trips, teacher workshops and special events.

THE COMMUNITY

Puyallup has plentiful housing and commuter rail and transit access, it's close to metropolitan cities, Sea-Tac International Airport and has easy access to Mount Rainier, hiking trails, Puget Sound and a variety of lakes and rivers perfect for fishing and boating enthusiasts.

Puyallup is home to the Washington State Fair, several restaurants and shopping centers, historic sites, art events, and a hub of medical and surgical facilities. A thriving auto sales industry, as well as a busy retail sector contribute to substantial sales tax revenues which fund vital downtown and public services.

Puyallup voters have shown overwhelming support of the Puyallup School District in recent bond and levy elections. In 2018 an Educational Programs and Operations Replacement Levy received 68.7 percent support. In 2015 voters supported an Elementary Construction Bond with 68.26 percent support.
